NOTES OF RIVENHALL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 7TH NOVEMBER 2023 IN RIVENHALL VILLAGE HALL

Present: Cllrs Turner (Chairman), Macrae, Wright, Cairns, Prime and Hammond

Also Present: Kevin Money (Parish Clerk), ECC Cllr Ross Playle, and one member of the public

Apologies: Cllr Abbott

Janet Stobart of the Rural Community Council of Essex (RCCE) gave a talk about undertaking a Neighbourhood Plan. Key areas covered were:-

- They are Community Led Plans
- There needs to be an assessment of land use and infrastructure
- Setting out a policy on the development and use of land
- When it becomes a development plan document
- Planning Objectives
- Key neighbourhood projects and infrastructure priorities
- Certain stages are Statutory ie Approval of the "Area and "Body"

- Average cost is about £15,000-£18,000 but grant funds are available
- There are five main stages
- Additional grants are available for hiring Planning Consultants
- Janet Stobart will assist but a planning expert is required
- Rivenhall would need to start on 01 January 2024 to obtain 2024 grant

Public Forum: A Neighbourhood Plan could offer an opportunity for Rivenhall to gain amenity land from unused parcels of A12 compulsorily purchased fields.

Chairman's Report: At the railway bridge and in the A12 underpass are two particular locations in Rivenhall End with unacceptable levels of flooding, vet it has become impossible to speak to anyone in Highways responsible for resolving these. The Chairman has written to our MP and is awaiting a response. On recent social media there have been comments regarding the incinerator, stating the parish council should be up in arms about this, and it should be top of their agenda: the Chairman reminded everyone that the parish council had objected most strongly to every incinerator planning application since the early 1990s when it was first mentioned, and has done ever since. The principle of a Rivenhall incinerator now has formal approval and construction is sadly underway. Henry Dixon Hall has agreed to store rock-salt for winter Rivenhall End use. The Rivenhall End noticeboard was damaged in the recent gales: it was suggested that Phil Little might store the detached nameboard and provide an estimate for repairs.

ECC Councillor report: re flooding at the A12 Underpass, this will be raised at the forthcoming highways liaison meeting. Potholes, more have been filled but some only have a "make-safe" repair, not a permanent repair. Ross Playle will press for the damaged footway to be repaired outside Henry Dixon Hall.

BDC Councillor Report: Braintree's Local Plan was adopted in 2022 but will be reviewed in 2024 with a view to its replacement being adopted in 2027. BDC completed its annual cut of roadside verges: this is a three-year trial to enhance biodiversity. It is likely parish councils will receive no street cleaning grant for 2024/5

General Maintenance: ECC forms to be printed and completed for three submissions for pedestrian road crossing points. No new quotations yet received for the war memorial restoration. The parish council will obtain a licence from BDC to re-create the village green flower beds on the village green near the Oak. The chairman thanked Cllr Hammond for clearing the war memorial garden in time for the Remembrance Sunday service.

Essex Waste Partnership Strategy: Cllr Abbott to draft a response for the council's consideration.

Greenhouses at Rivenhall Airfield: We have already objected to these plans, but the proposer offered to come and give the council a presentation. As there is nothing "new" currently proposed, we declined the offer until or unless new plans are submitted.

Rivenhall Incinerator: As no new plans are on the table, it was decided not to invite IWMF's John Tatton to the January 2024 meeting.

Planning Matters:

- Electric Gates at Park Gate Farmhouse: we had no objections
- Solar Farm on land off Park Road, Rivenhall. The Appeal starts at 10:00 on 12 December 2023 at Howard Hall, Braintree Masonic Centre, Bocking End. Rivenhall Parish Council had objected to this application.

Rivenhall Millennium Committee - Christmas Events

In just a few weeks' time we will put 2023 behind us, and let us hope that 2024 will be safer and less violent world.

The Rivenhall Millennium Committee will, as normal, be offering a little brightness and cheer to all our residents over Christmas. We intend to erect the Rivenhall Christmas tree and lights on **Saturday 9**th **December**.

On **Sunday 17th December** we plan to guide Santa around the village in his sleigh: we will leave Rivenhall Hall about 3:30 pm. Santa's helpers will deliver a gift to all homes with a resident aged 70 or over, and sweets to all the children who come out to see Santa. If you are unable to be outside, please do give Santa a wave from your window as we would love to see you. If the weather is very wet, we may need to put back this event. About a week before this, Santa;s helpers will be delivering a Christmas card to every home in Rivenhall.

On **Tuesday 19th December** we will hold our annual Carols on the Green around the Christmas tree, accompanied by the Chelmsford Silver Band: this will start at 7:30 pm. In the event of bad weather, we will assemble in Rivenhall Village Hall for the carols. Following the carols there is a free village get-together in the Village hall with delicious pastries, fruit juice and mulled wine: on stage the Chelmsford Silver Band will be playing their delightful medleys of seasonal tunes. Of course there will be the usual fabulous raffle!

The Rivenhall Millennium Committee wishes all residents a very happy Christmas and a prosperous New Year.



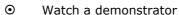

Turning the pages of History Research by Tracy Scott

2023 Christmas is upon us, so let's look at a few articles I have found relating from Christmases from Rivenhall and Silver End's past.

In 1871 at Hoo Hall by kind permission of Mr. Porter a very musing and instructive lecture was delivered by Mr. J. Orst. "Christmas festivities and ceremonies of the olden time." The lecture described the various customs in different parts of the country, with attention paid to customs peculiar to Essex especially those of Rivenhall and neighbouring places. The outdoor customs of Christmas-Eve were illustrated by members of the Kelvedon Band of Hope reciting carols and playing fifes (a medieval wind instrument similar to a flute) kettle drums, and bones. The part strong drink played in those customs, was adverted to, and warnings given of its insidious tendency.

1895 The widows and large families of Rivenhall were given a gift of Coals. These were purchased with the proceeds of the late concert and a donation from Mrs. Parker of Durwards Hall.

1909 In the Church magazine of that year the Rector Herbert Henry Willmott wrote this: The Feast of Christmas

The Festival of Holy Christmas, with all its sacred association, is close at hand. It is the Birthday of God manifest in the Flesh, a day of rejoicing for all mankind. The world forgets all about the Sacred Infant and devotes the day to gormandizing and drinking, thereby losing the true happiness of Christmas, and also causing injury to these bodies of ours, so fearfully and wonderfully made. These foolish people not only injure their spiritual life, but also empty their pockets, and generally have to go to the doctor to be set right. How strange it is that so many should act in this senseless manner. If is a vivid illustration of the cynical assertion of Thomas Carlyle to the effect that most people in these island are fools. But by God's graces we will not so spend Christmas.

Let each faithful son and daughter of the Church be found at the altar, on that Sacred day to receive the Bread of Life. There was no room in the Inn for the Child-God on that first Christmas morn. Let Him find a shelter in our hearts on Christmas Day.

1939 The Silver End section of the British Legion held a Christmas party in the Village Hall. Mrs Tinworth presiding and supervising the arrangements made by the committee. Festive greetings were sent to Mrs. Maunsell Bradhurst, president, who was unable to be present. Woollen knitted comforts were parcelled and despatch to Legionnaires serving at home and abroad. Refreshments of Christmas cake and mince pies and many novel competitions were arranged in a musical evening. Winners included Mrs Thynne (whistling) and Mrs Reynolds (jumbled names)

1939 A Children's Christmas Concert was organised by the Crittall Athletic Club. This was enjoyed by a crowed audience in the Village Hall. The children provide much of the talent, prizes being awarded for the best "turns." Frank Sturge, aged 9, secured premier award with a recitation: Joan Taylor and Olive Wright were second with a duet; and Betty Anderson sang and tap-danced to obtain the third. Consolation winners were M. Bletchley. J. Holland, P. Jones, Iris Aldridge and K. Demicol. Mr. W. Cary (Witham) infused humour into the programme, assisted by Mr. T. W. Scriverner, who also compered and Mr Bert Collier of "Band Wagon" fame, played the **trumpet.** Mr Charles Jones was in general charge.

1940 Rivenhall Church Hall (Village Hall) was host to entertain Rivenhall and evacuee Children in fine style with a Christmas party. Included in the menu of eats, Pheasants, cakes, plum puddings and each child had a cracker. 145 children were entertained by Clown Bertram and reported they had a very happy time. Mrs Bradhurst and Mrs Fitzgerald distributed toys to each child and was organised by Col. A. Wood of Rivenhall Place.

I would like to wish you all warmth and good health over Christmas and the coming year. I leave you with this: December 21st is the winter solstice – the longest night and the shortest day. It is said wherever the wind is on this day, there it will stop for the next month. It is also St. Thomas's Day; on this day old women went 'a-Thomasing' or collecting money.

The 2023 Famous Rivenhall Races

In Rivenhall village hall on 28 October, the Rivenhall Millennium Committee held its popular fund-raising race night which has now been going for 21 years!

Yet another sell-out full grandstand enjoyed the camaraderie of village folk coming together to relax, chat, laugh, joke, and have an all-together light-hearted evening.

Chief Steward and Master of Ceremonies was our Rivenhall Millennium Committee Chairman Bob Turner. On the Tote were young Wilson Kerr and Jack Prime BEM. John Macrae again created the race card.

This annual village event (Covid years excepted) raises essential monies that all go to support various winter charitable actions that bring our village community together.

Specimen Christmas trees now cost about £900! The Committee purchases, erects, and illuminates a tree every year for the village to enjoy. Carols on the green with the Chelmsford Silver Band, a follow-on free village get-together with music, snacks, raffle and refreshments, Christmas cards to every home, gifts to all households with a member aged 70 or over, and our Santa Sleigh that glides round the village just before Christmas, are just a few of its enterprises!

The photo shows one of our horse races in progress, amidst much cheering and support from the punters. Hi there

I'm Steve Lawes, a freelance artist, community arts professional, and medievalist based in Southend-on-Sea.

Together with Unpuzzled Theatre CIC, I created a Knight at the Museum – an interactive arts and theatre experience based around the story of the Prittlewell Prince, Southend's nationally-significant Anglo-Saxon archaeological find. Through a 45-minute play and 1-hour arts workshop, we delve into the history and myth of this unknown member of the East Saxons' royal family. As you may know, the Prittlewell Prince is incredibly important as the artefacts found in his tomb have challenged our historical understanding around the dating of the conversion of the English to Christianity.

In summer 2023, we received funding from Arts Council England to deliver this programme at Southend Central Museum. Now, we are looking forward to the summer of 2024 and want to take our work to a wider audience. We are currently writing a funding bid to Essex

County Council, due on December 10th, to tour this work to churches that have an Anglo-Saxon connection throughout the county. The ancient churches in Essex are a significant symbol of the process of the conversion of the pagan East Saxons, and therefore the perfect place to host this work.

We would be delighted if you would consider putting your church forward as a site for the play. The play will be free to the public, helping your church to reach new people interested in heritage, and opening the possibility of the church being used as a venue for a wider range of activities.

In order to help bolster our funding bid, we would really appreciate you putting a few details in a short letter:

- 1. That you would like to be involved, and can offer us the use of the space free of charge for up to two days in the summer holidays
- 2. Any potential dates that we could be a part of (for example, heritage open days) during the summer holidays (late-July end of August 2024); or, if not applicable, just what days would be best for us to come generally in the summer.
- 3. If possible, a brief sentence or two about how this will encourage visitors to your church

Finally, if you could give any of the following logistical details to us separate from the above, that would really help us with planning:

- 1. Any logistical issues with access to your site
- 2. Any contact details for group/organisation leaders in your community we should send marketing information to
- 3. Anything else that we should need to consider




